(Green) We are Proud of the CHS girls’ tennis team who understand shared values and dreams. They are a group of athletes that conduct themselves with integrity, respect and commitment. The girls finished in the top 8 at state, they are Kiersten Housenga, Kaitlynn Green, Kaylee Camp, Lacy Pickney, MacKenzie Lange, Kylie Housenga, and Lanie Schmitz.

(Gettes) We are Proud of CMS teacher Reggie Hall and CMS students who spruced up the landscaping around the CMS sign. Plants were retrieved from the old Lyons Middle School and transplanted to their new location. The students put in a lot of hard work to give new curb appeal to the CMS entrance!

(Sullivan-Pope) We are Proud of Whittier 5th grade who was awarded the Project Jack Grant. It is a pay it forward grant of \$250 to be donated to a project that helps people in Iowa. Mrs. Haskell’s class sewed pillowcases for an organization called My Gear Outreach, which preps bags to be given to kids entering foster care and are given a bag of supplies along with a pillow and pillowcase. Miss Determan’s class made blankets for the Humane Society and used the rest of the money to buy things the Humane Society needed.
