

Lt. Eric Hosette Scholarship

Lt. Eric Hosette made the ultimate sacrifice in the line of duty on January 5, 2019. Hosette will forever be remembered as a true hero who answered his final call doing what he loved to do. He knew that his fellow firefighters would be ready to carry on his passion as a first responder. To honor Eric's service and dedication to the City of Clinton, the Lt. Eric Hosette Scholarship has been created for one student from Clinton High to begin their career as a firefighter or paramedic.

The Lt. Eric Hosette Scholarship is awarded each year to a graduating high school senior from Clinton High School who has the intent to serve in a public safety capacity. One tuition scholarship will be awarded for EMT-B certification (Fire, EMS). Applications will be judged on the basis of the following criteria: class standing, letter of recommendations, essay, and location the applicant will serve once certification is completed. If there are no qualified applicants, no award will be made for that year. This year the scholarship will be in the amount of \$1,600 to cover the cost of one class towards the EMT-B Certification. The applications are available in January of the current graduating school year. Application deadline is **March 15, 2021**.

Scholarship Criteria: Goal is to receive your EMT-B Certificate and gain a career as a Paramedic or Firefighter

- Graduating High School Senior in the academic year of 2021
- Minimum 2.75 GPA based on a 4.0 grading system.
- Two Letters of Recommendation
- Submit a two page or less typed, double spaced essay covering the following question below

The Scholarship committee, who will make the selection, will consist of Mr. Kuch, Clinton High School Principal, Mrs. Steines, Clinton High School Counselor, and Mrs. Leafgreen, Clinton High School Teacher.

Scholarship money will be paid directly to the recipients. In the event the scholarship recipients fail to use the scholarship as required and intended, the full amount shall be returned to the scholarship fund to use in ensuing years.

There will be no scholarship restriction based on age, sex, color, race, nationality, and/or religion. Students who have any disabilities or parents with disabilities are encouraged to apply.

Applications must be completed and submitted to the high school Counselors Office no later than **March 15, 2021** at the end of the school day.
