

# College Connection Individualized Registration & Concurrent Enrollment

**College Connection Individualized Registration (CCIR):** CCIR used to be called PSEO. However in 2016 the state of Iowa made changes to the Senior Year Plus program bringing about CCIR. Courses given through a college or university which the school district pays for if the student passes the course. These classes can be taught at either the college/university or online. Students receive a pass/fail grade on their high school transcript and the course cannot count towards specific graduation requirements.

**Concurrent Enrollment Courses:** courses taught by Clinton High School teachers that earn students college credit.

The Clinton Community School District provides students an opportunity to participate in the Post Secondary Enrollment Act through Clinton Community College and online courses. This policy permits an eligible high school student to enroll in a planned educational program. Students may enroll in college courses and earn high school as well as college credit.

- Students must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 in order to enroll in a CCIR course.
- Students must be proficient in all areas of the Iowa Assessments (Reading Comprehension, Math, and Science) to be eligible for any CCIR and concurrent enrollment courses in the areas of science, art, and music.
- Students must have taken the ACT or ALEKS math exam prior to enrolling in certain CCIR and concurrent enrollment courses.
- Students must earn course requirements for graduation in the Clinton Community School District at Clinton High School.
- Students must have completed courses in core requirements before being allowed to take additional courses in core areas.
- It is suggested that a student take a comparable high school course prior to enrolling in a CCIR course of the same content.
- Students must be full time students.
- Students are allowed to take a maximum of 1 CCIR course per semester.
- The course allotment covers tuition. Students are responsible for buying their books.
- Students withdrawing from a CCIR course(s) prior to completion will bear the responsibility and cost of reimbursing the Clinton Community School District for the course including tuition, fees, etc.
- Final approval must be given by the Clinton High School principal.
- Students who take courses during the summer months when school is not in session shall be responsible for the cost of attendance for courses. These courses will not be accepted as Clinton High School credits.
- Students who earn a cumulative **college** GPA of 1.75 or below may be placed on financial aid suspension and will be ineligible for federal and state financial aid.



Students interested in taking any CCIR/Concurrent Enrollment courses should schedule an appointment with their counselor.
