

Scholarships Activated During the 2018-2019 School Year

- Adland, Edwin R. & Ruth H. Scholarship** - This scholarship is intended to assist the average student achieve a college education at Augustana College, Iowa State University, or the University of Northern Iowa. The \$5,000 yearly scholarship is renewable over four years based on maintenance of a 2.0 GPA. Total award is valued at \$20,000. Requirements and selection criteria for this scholarship include: Recipient must plan to attend Augustana College, Rock Island, Illinois; Iowa State University or the University of Northern Iowa. Financial need is the main criteria. Student must be of good character. Although not an emphasis on academics, the applicant must have at least a 2.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale. Applications must be submitted via the Community Foundation of the Great River Bend online system, including letters of recommendation and transcripts. Apply at: www.cfgrb.org and then click on Student Scholarships. **Application deadline: February 15, 2018.**
- Alger, Horatio Scholarship** – The Horatio Alger Iowa Scholarship Programs provide financial assistance to students throughout the nation who have financial need and have exhibited integrity and perseverance in overcoming personal adversity. The scholarships are given to deserving students each year and range in award value from \$7,000 to \$22,000. Applications may be filed on-line at: scholars.horatioalger.org. To be eligible applicants must meet the following criteria: Critical financial need (\$55,000 or less adjusted gross income per family is required); involvement in co-curricular and community activities; demonstrate academic achievement (minimum GPA of 2.0), be a US citizen and have a strong commitment to pursue and complete a bachelor's degree at an accredited institution located in the US (students may start their studies at a 2-yr. institution and then transfer to a 4-yr institution). Once you have submitted your on-line application ask your CHS counselor to complete the on-line certification page required to complete your application process. Applications must be submitted and certified by October 25, 2016. **Deadline: October 25, 2016**
- Alger, Horatio Association Career & Technical Scholarship Program** – This program will provide support for students seeking to pursue career or technical education in a post-secondary environment the fall of 2018. Students must have financial need and have exhibited integrity and perseverance in overcoming personal adversity. Scholarship criteria also includes completion of high school, Federal Pell grant-eligibility, enrollment by fall 2018 with a commitment to pursue and complete a career or technical certificate/degree, and United States citizenship. The Horatio Alger Association will award up to 1020 scholarships in 2018 with a maximum award amount of \$2,500 depending on the length and cost of the program of study. - American Chemical Society Scholarship Illinois-Iowa Chapter** - The Donald Kiser Memorial Scholarship is a one-year, non-renewable merit based \$1000 award for students pursuing studies in chemistry, biochemistry, or chemical engineering. Applicants must be a resident of one of the following counties in Illinois: Bureau, Carroll, Henderson, Henry, Jo Daviess, Mercer, Rock Island, Warren or Whiteside. In Iowa: Clinton, Dubuque, Jackson, Muscatine or Scott. Applicants must mail completed application, transcript, and two scholarship reference forms. The application must be completed and returned on or before March 1st. **Deadline: March 1, 2018.**
- American Legion Auxiliary Second District Iowa (related to Veteran)** – Three \$300 Merit Awards are available. Requirements include: 1. The applicant must be either a member of the American Legion Auxiliary, or the daughter, granddaughter, great-granddaughter, sister, wife, son, grandson, great-grandson, brother, widow, husband, or step-relative of a WWI, WWII, Korean, Vietnam, Granada/Lebanon, Panama, Persian Gulf, or present conflict Veteran. 2. The applicant must be a resident of the Second District, attend high school in the Second District, or be eligible through a person paying dues in the Second District Legion or Auxiliary and reside in a District adjacent to the Second District. The Second District includes the following counties: Dubuque, Jackson, **Clinton**, Scott, Linn and Jones. The applicant must be, or must plan to be enrolled in a school in the State of Iowa. Application, photograph, transcript, one letter of recommendation and a personal letter should be mailed and received by American Legion by March 15th. **Deadline: March 15, 2018**
- American Legion, Second District of Iowa, Merit Awards (not related to vet.)** - Two \$500 general Merit Awards will be available to graduating seniors residing in the American Legion Second District of Iowa (Clinton, Dubuque, Jackson, Linn, Jones, or Scott counties) who plan to attend college in the state of Iowa. It is **not** necessary to be related to a member of the American Legion or Auxiliary. Awards will be sent to the student after proof of completion of the first semester of the freshman year and proof of enrollment for the second semester. Applicants must complete an application; provide personal letter and copy of transcript. All application materials must be received no later than March 31, 2018. **Deadline: March 31, 2018.**
- AMVETS POST #28 Scholarship** – A \$500 scholarship will be given to a graduating senior. The scholarship can be used at any accredited college or university including any area community college or technical trade school. There are no restrictions as to a course of study. Applicants must be the son or daughter or grandchild of a Post 28 AMVETS member. Stepchildren, foster children and other children dependent upon the member for support and living with the member in a regular parent-child relationship are eligible. A deceased member's child is eligible. The



completed application and a copy of your transcript must be mailed on or before April 1, 2018. **Deadline: April 1, 2018.**

Anderson, Edward O. Scholarship Fund – The Edward O. Anderson family will offer a \$1000 scholarship to a CHS senior who plans to major in the health care field. Financial need and scholastic achievement will be considered. Three letters of recommendation must be provided. Application material must be returned to the School Counseling Office. Top three finalists will be interviewed by the scholarship committee which will then make the final decision. **Deadline: on or before April 4, 2018.**

Ascentra Credit Union – Ascentra Credit Union offers ten \$1,000 scholarships to assist members planning to further their education beyond high school. The scholarships will be awarded as follows: five scholarships for high school students planning to enter college and five scholarships for members age 19 or over, considered non-traditional-aged or continuing education students. The high school scholarship is open to any high school student classified as either a junior or senior, with a projected graduation at the completion of the following fall or spring semester. Applicants must have an account established in their own name and be “members in good standing” at Ascentra Credit Union. Essay topic: “What does my credit union membership mean to me?” Entries must be postmarked no later than March 3, 2018. **Deadline: March 1, 2018**

Aspiring Nurse Scholarship – The Aspiring Nurse scholarship will award a \$1000 scholarship to a future nurse in the high school graduating class of 2018. The winner will best demonstrate: a track record of academic excellence, particularly in science and mathematics courses and a passion for the nursing profession and the overall field of healthcare. The scholarship is open to all U.S. high school seniors who plan to pursue college education in nursing, including LPN/LVN, AND, and BSN programs. Applicants must be in good academic standing and on track to graduate from high school at the conclusion of the 2017-18 academic year. Only one application entry is accepted per student. Interested students must complete the application online and submit a 500 word essay into the site. AXA Achievement Scholarship – Scholarship amounts of \$2500, \$10,000 or \$25,000 will be awarded. Students applying to the AXA Achievement Scholarship must be a US Citizen or legal resident living or claiming residency in one of the 50 United States, Washington, D.C. or Puerto Rico. Be a current high school senior who plans to enroll full-time in an accredited two-year or four-year college or university in the United States for the entire 2018-19 academic year. Demonstrate ambition and self-drive as evidenced by outstanding achievement in school, community or work-related activities. You will need the following information for the application process: list of involvement in school and community activities, list of work experience, current high school cumulative GPA on 4.0 scale, and details of your outstanding achievement. (Make sure to read through the online application’s essay questions and carefully consider your responses. Be sure to fully capture and articulate what makes your achievement truly outstanding.) Bates, Dearrel Memorial Scholarship – This \$1000 scholarship was created in memory of Quad City Times sports writer Dearrel Bates. Applicants must be a high school senior graduating from a MAC Conference high school, excluding Burlington, Iowa. Recipients must be full-time student working toward a bachelor degree in Education. Financial need is the main criteria. Merit evaluated by school activities, community, personal, and work experience. Applicant must have at least a 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale. Applications must be submitted via the Community Foundation of the Great River Bend online system, including letters of recommendation and transcripts. - Bi-Annual \$1000 Environmental Awareness Scholarship** – This scholarship is made possible by private funds from ReuseThisBag.com. Two scholarships will be presented, each as a \$1000 check in the winner’s name or to an accredited school in the name of the winner. Scholarship essay entries must be received by the due date of the deadline. Essay questions change every year. The 2018 scholarship essay topic is: Climate change is a hotly contested debate. Tell us about how you think climate change will impact future generations. Only one entry per person, group or classroom will be accepted. Scholarships are offered every September 1st and February 1st. Winners will be announced in Fall and Spring of each year. **Spring deadline: February 1st. Fall deadline: September 1st.**
- Birt-Steeg, Hannah Memorial Scholarship** – A \$500 memorial scholarship was established by the family and friends of Hannah Birt-Steeg. - Boardsen, Dan Memorial Scholarship** – The \$500 Dan “Daddy” Boardsen scholarship is to be awarded to a student that exemplifies the teachings and beliefs of Dan Boardsen, during his 25 year career as a counselor at Washington Middle School. Dan impressed upon every student that they were capable to rise above the hardships they’ve encountered and to believe in themselves. Application requirements include: 2 letters of recommendation, transcript, 1 page essay, list of extra-curricular, school and community involvement over the last four years, GPA showing improvement during high school career and completed Boardsen application. Application materials should be turned into the Counseling Office at CHS. Deadline to apply is April 4th. **Deadline: April 4, 2018.**
- Brand Boeshaar Scholarship** – The Brand Boeshaar Scholarship Program awards four scholarships annually to students who wish to earn a degree in Fine Art, Graphic Design or Art Education at a college or university. To be considered for this prestigious Brand Boeshaar Scholarship applicants must be a graduating senior from a public or private high school in one of the following education service areas: Mississippi Bend AEA9 (Iowa), Rock Island County Regional Office of Education (Illinois), and Bureau, Henry and Stark County Regional Office of Education (Illinois). Candidate must have a GPA of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale, submit a completed application, high school transcript, two letters of support, and a portfolio of 12 works. Must enroll in a fine art, commercial art or art education academic program at a college or university. May double major as long as one major is an approved field of study in art. Each Scholarship award is \$3000 for the first academic year. Scholarships will be renewed for three subsequent years, based on continued scholastic achievement in the student’s designated major. If renewed, recipient will receive \$12,000 over four years. Materials received after March 10th will not be considered. Scholarship applications and portfolios must be delivered to the Figge Art Museum on Friday, March 9th from 10 – 5 p.m. or Saturday, March 10th from 10 – 1 p.m. **Deadline: March 9th and 10th, 2018.**
- Brett, Elise Scholarship** – This scholarship is awarded every four years and will be awarded in 2018. A scholarship of up to \$1000 per year for four years is available for seniors that plan to attend an accredited educational institution to earn a college degree or a career-related certificate. Applicant must have earned at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA in high school or in their most recent formal education. However, academic achievement should not be the primary determining factor in selecting a recipient from those who meet eligibility requirements. The main criteria is the applicant’s demonstration of the connection of their educational plans to their career goals through essay, activities, and academics. Other criteria include community involvement and leadership, and academic achievement (25%). Financial need is not a consideration. Preference will be given to applicants who are not high school seniors (current college students or non-traditional students). Renewal is dependent on making adequate academic progress or the maintenance of at least a 2.0 GPA. Applications must be submitted via The Community Foundation of the Great River Bend online system, including letters of recommendation and transcripts. - Brown, Ron Scholar Program** – The Ron Brown Scholarship Program is dedicated to improving the lives of young African Americans and empowering and supporting them to achieve their potential within their chosen academic disciplines and into the workforce. The RBSP awards 20 or more new scholarships in the amount of \$40,000 each year (\$10,000 per year for 4 years) to talented high school seniors. Recipients may use the need and merit-based scholarships to attend any four-year accredited college/university within the United States. To be eligible, applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents, Black/African American and current high school seniors at the time of their application. Criteria includes: List of extracurricular, community, employment or other activities, list of significant awards or honors you have received during high school for academic or extracurricular achievements, response to two essay questions, two letter of recommendation, official transcript and completed application. The Ron Brown Scholar Program has two deadlines for applications (students must be current high



school seniors at the time of their application): November 1 (postmarked) – application will be given early consideration for the Ron Brown Scholar Program, January 9 (postmarked) final deadline in order to be considered. Bulechek, Louis F. Memorial Scholarship – A scholarship in the amount of up to \$4000 will be awarded and is renewable over four years, totaling \$16,000. Applicants shall have at least a 2.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale. Applicant must plan to enroll in a college/university for the purpose of earning credits for a bachelor degree. Financial need will be the major criteria. Merit evaluated by school activities, community and personal activities, and work experience. This scholarship may be used to pay tuition only. Applications must be submitted via the Community Foundation of the Great River Bend online system, including letters of recommendation and transcripts. Apply at: www.cfgrb.org **Deadline: February 15, 2018.**

Carnes, Ivan H. Memorial Scholarship – Ivan H. Carnes loved the Clinton community and was a business and community leader; and President of Clinton National Bank and Carnes Oil Company. Upon his death his wife wanted the community to remember him, so she created a memorial scholarship in his name. The Carnes Memorial Scholarship fund will award an amount of \$1,000 to one CHS senior who ranks in the top half of their class. Financial need, leadership qualities, and concern for others shall be among the factors considered. Applicant must write a letter expressing reasons why he/she should be selected and list a name and address of someone who knows them well and is willing to write a letter of recommendation. **(The letter does not need to be written at this time.)** A transcript must also be included. Return all materials to the Counseling Office. **Deadline: on or before March 19, 2018.**

CCC Quiz Bowl Scholarship – One \$700 tuition grant will be available to any CHS senior planning to attend Clinton Community College during the 2018-2019 school year. This grant is made available thanks to the CHS Quiz Bowl Team which took 1st place in the December 2017 Quiz Bowl competition hosted by CCC. The team received a 1st place trophy and the \$700 tuition grant. The Quiz Bowl Grant application and one letter of recommendation must be returned to the CHS school counseling office by April 4, 2018. **Deadline: April 4, 2018.**

CHS Class of 1953 Scholarship – A scholarship formed by members of the Clinton High graduating Class of 1953 will award one \$1000 scholarship to graduating seniors. This scholarship is open to all seniors entering any field of study. Application requirements: recipient must be a citizen or legal permanent resident of the United States, GPA of 2.5 or better, provide 2 letters of recommendation, high school transcript, 500-word essay, list of school/community involvement, financial need, and completed April 4th. **Deadline: April 4, 2018.**

Children's Cancer Connection Empowering Scholarship – The Children's Cancer Connection, since 1988, has focused on the mission of enhancing the lives of children and their families affected by childhood cancer who are living, treated and/or diagnosed in the state of Iowa. The Ockenfels' Family Foundation's mission strives to be a caring member of the childhood cancer journey, no matter where that journey takes an individual and their family. Four different scholarships will be awarded: \$500 Book Reimbursement, \$1000 Tuition Assistance, \$2500 Tuition Assistance and the \$5000 Debbie Ockenfels Memorial Scholarship. Eligibility to apply for Children's Cancer Connection Empowering Scholarships: applicant must be directly affected by childhood cancer (includes individuals who currently have or have had cancer before age 18, or a sibling of that individual), applicant must be within Children's Cancer Connection service area (living, treated or diagnosed in the state of Iowa), Applicant must attend an accredited two or four year institution (trade school, college or university), and applicant must have a minimum GPA of 2.5. Requirements to apply for scholarship if you meet eligibility requirements: complete application with written two 500 word essays, two letters of recommendation from school, medical or business professional. If selected as a recipient, you will need to complete 10-40 hours of volunteer support dependent upon awarded scholarship. Applications for the Fall semester are due the last Friday in May. Applications for the Spring semester are due the last Friday in September. Claim Aid & Iowa Assoc. of School Boards Scholarships – Claim Aid and IASB is offering two - \$2000 one-time scholarships to graduating seniors that will be continuing their education at a college or university. **The Star Student Scholarship of Iowa** will be awarded to a Special Education graduating senior student who will continue his/her education at a college or university. **The Special Education Teacher Scholarship of Iowa** will be awarded to a graduating senior student who will continue his/her education at a college or university and is planning to study Education, specifically Special Education. Each scholarship will be a one-time \$2000 award. To be eligible the student must: graduate in 2018, continue education at a college or university; attend a high school within a school district that participates in the IASB/ClaimAid Medicaid Reimbursement Program (IMED). Clinton Community College/Paul B. Sharar Foundation Scholarships – The Clinton Community College/Paul B. Sharar Foundation is currently accepting scholarship applications for the 2017-2018 spring semester. You can apply for all scholarships offered at any Eastern Iowa Community College of your choice with just one application submission. Sharar Foundation scholarships are based on financial need, program of study, community service, geographic area, alumni parents, academic promise, athletics, and academic achievement. A cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher is required to be eligible for scholarships. Those individuals with lower GPA's may wish to explain their special circumstances in the letter addressing the scholarship awarding committee. Scholarship amounts range from \$200 to the Honor Scholarships. Questions regarding Clinton Community College scholarships should be directed to the Sharar Foundation at 563-244-7040. Clinton Community Para-educator Scholarship – Two \$250 scholarships are available to the child or foster child of a Clinton Community Para-educator (assistant). Para-educators are also eligible for this scholarship. (Please note: Applicant's parent must be a C.C.P. paid dues member for two years.) The purpose of this award is to encourage an individual in a pursuit of continued education; both full-time and part-time students will be considered. A GPA of 2.75 is required. One letter of recommendation should be included with completed application. **Deadline: April 15, 2018.**

Clinton County Development Association Scholarship – Nine \$1000 scholarships are available to students who exhibit good character in their school and community. Students must have applied and been accepted to a four year or two year college, or technical school, provide one letter of recommendation, and must write an essay containing approximately 500 words describing why they feel they deserve this scholarship. The essay should include specific examples describing how they have shown characteristics such as honesty, integrity, determination, respect, responsibility, fairness, and/or kindness. Volunteer work in the community and/or involvement in your school community should be noted. Application materials must be returned to the School Counseling Office. **Deadline: Thursday, April 19, 2018.**

Clinton County Master Gardener Scholarship - This scholarship is open to any graduating high school senior residing in Clinton County with a cumulative GPA above 2.5. Applicant must be accepted at an accredited institution of higher learning to pursue a degree in Horticulture. The \$500 scholarship is non-renewable and will be paid directly to the college in the amount of \$250 each semester. A committee of Master Gardeners will select the recipient. Students must submit completed application, transcript, essay, and two letters of recommendation. Deadline to apply is May 1, 2018. **Deadline: May 1, 2018**

Clinton Fine Arts Assoc. Inc. Scholarship – The purpose of this scholarship is to reward deserving graduating seniors in the city of Clinton for their participation in and contribution to the arts (musical or artistically) and its many activities and events. A \$500 scholarship will be awarded and students from Clinton High, Prince of Peace, or homeschooled seniors are encouraged to apply. Applicants must have participated in fine arts activities in high school, have a minimum 3.0 GPA, and plan to pursue a degree at an accredited two or four-year institution. (That degree need not be in fine arts.) Preference will be given to children of CFAA members. Requirements: complete application and submit required documentation, two letters of recommendation from a non-family source, high school transcript, 300-500 word essay on the topic "How the arts have impacted my life" or provide a portfolio of personal creations or a five minute performance video, must have a minimum of 25 volunteer hours during senior year and show proof of acceptance at an accredited education institution before scholarship can be paid. Completed application and materials must be returned to the Clinton Fine Arts Association Inc. no later than April 1, 2018. Late applications will not be considered. **Deadline: April 1, 2018**

Clinton Firefighters Local 609 - Ben Jess Memorial Scholarship – The Clinton Firefighters Memorial scholarship fund is an annual award of \$500 to be given to 4 graduating seniors from either: Clinton or Prince of Peace High Schools who intend to further their education at an approved institution. The scholarship is in memory of Ben Jess, who was a Clinton Firefighter from March 1988 until April 1992 when he was forced to retire after being diagnosed with ALS. Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS) is a form of Muscular Dystrophy, better known as Lou Gehrig's disease. To apply students need to: complete an application, include 2 letters of recommendation from someone other than a relative, enclose an official high school transcript, and have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better. Students who have
