

Margaret Davis History Scholarship

Margaret Davis taught in the Social Studies Department
from 1916 to 1946. She died in 1960.

This annual scholarship may be awarded to one student or divided between two members of the graduating class. The amount awarded is determined by the interest earned on the initial investment made by the Davis family. The scholarship amount for the Class of 2023 will be \$200.00.

The candidates will need to fulfill the following scholarship criteria:

- **Overall grade point average of 3.0**
- **Social Studies GPA of 3.0**
- **Seven credits in Social Studies area OR**
- **Six credits of Social Studies which includes AP Government, AP Economics, AP Psychology, AP World History and AP US History**

In addition to academic qualification and completing the application form, the applicant must submit to the scholarship committee **a paper of 400-500 words** on a topic chosen by the social studies department. **The paper must be completed in standard research paper format.**

The applicants must also submit the names of two references that will be able to discuss with the selection committee the candidate's potential and personal character.

Finalists for the scholarship may be invited to a personal interview by the scholarship selection committee. The committee will consist of a three-member group of social studies staff, chosen annually by the Social Studies Department chairperson. The winners will be selected on the basis of their paper; and school and community citizenship.

When the candidate's college admission is assured, the scholarship award will be sent to the college selected by the winner/s.

Recipient will be notified prior to Senior Convocation in May and will be expected to attend Convocation for the formal presentation of this scholarship.
